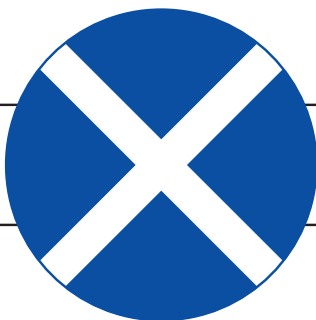

For On-line entries only

You will receive your Exhibitors Passes at the appropriate time through your personal on-line account - **Not through the post**

Approximately 2 weeks before the show you will be informed by email that your Exhibitors Passes are in your account + by SMS text to your mobile phone if you wish.

Take these steps: Login to your account and choose the option 'My Historical Entries & Payments' there you will see with your Show Entry record a line saying Download your Exhibitors Pass - click this link and your Exhibitors Pass will appear - print it - take it to the show. There may also be a Show Information Leaflet - print this.

Be aware that the Exhibitors Passes are not sent to you by email but will be in your www.dog.biz account ready to be printed off by you and used at the show in the normal way. This will be a great saving to the Society of the postal costs; envelopes etc.

Exhibitors making postal entries will receive their Exhibitors Passes by Post in the usual way.

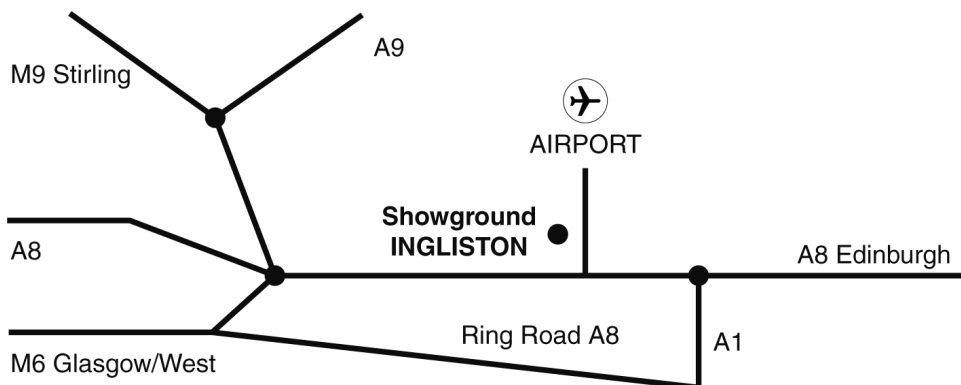
• **VENUE OF CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW** •

The venue for our thirty-first Championship Show is again the spacious Highland Hall at the Royal Highland Showground, Ingliston, Edinburgh. All breeds will be on the ground level and there will be Trade Stands offering a wide variety of merchandise.

Facilities include excellent catering and bar facilities at reasonable prices.

Parking facilities are available for cars and coaches adjacent to the Hall.

Access is by the same route as that to the Showground itself. The site is on the main Edinburgh/Glasgow road (A8) just beyond the Edinburgh City Boundary and a few hundred yards from Edinburgh Airport. The city centre is reached within 15 minutes.



ATTENTION ALL EXHIBITORS

- **JUDGING ARRANGEMENTS**

Judging will start at 9.30 am. The Show closes half an hour after judging is completed.

- **FREE ADMISSION FOR EXHIBITORS AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC**

- **EXHIBITORS' PASSES/ORDER OF JUDGING**

Exhibitors' Passes and Order of Judging will be posted (postal entries), or will be available to download from your dog.biz account (online entries).

- **NOT FOR COMPETITION**

Dogs may be entered N.F.C. and will be benched with their respective breeds. Fees detailed separately in this Schedule.

- **MEMBERSHIP (from 1st Jan 2012)**

Exhibitors are reminded that membership of G.B.A.S. is open to all, and you are invited to join. The annual subscription is £10.00 Single, £12.00 Joint (i.e. Husband and Wife, two members of the same family or two bona-fide partners); £5.00 Junior (under 16 years of age). Applications to the Hon. Secretary.

- **COACH PARTIES**

A special free parking area will be available for coaches.

- **CARS**

More than ample space is available adjacent to the Highland Hall for the parking of cars.

- **FIRST AID**

Personnel from St. Andrew's Ambulance Association will be on hand throughout the Show.

- **VETERINARY SERVICES**

These will be available if required from the Hon. Veterinary Surgeon who will be in attendance for the duration of the Show.

- **CLEANLINESS AND EXERCISE AREA**

A large public attendance is expected at the Show and exhibitors and handlers are asked to assist by observing the highest standards of dog cleanliness. This applies particularly to the Show entrance and walkways.

Please use the litter bins provided for all paper, refuse, etc., and help us to retain this venue by keeping it clean and free of litter.

The exercise area for dogs will be outside but within the curtilage of the Highland Hall and access will be obtained via the Main Foyer (West).

Please do not trespass on any part of the Show Ground outside the Dog Show Area and exercise your dogs only in the exercise area provided for you.

Exhibitors and handlers will be expected to clear up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge. Whilst special containers for use of exhibitors and handlers and, if possible equipment to deal with fouling will be provided, this will not absolve those responsible for dogs, being properly equipped.

Special stewards will be on duty in an effort to ensure that the foregoing requirements are carried out and the dog-showing public is encouraged to assist by active participation and by reporting those who fail in their responsibilities to the Show Management and, if necessary, the Kennel Club.

- **CHALKING**

Exhibitors are reminded of the regulations with regard to chalking.

ENTRY FORMS

It would be of the greatest assistance if, in completing their entry forms, exhibitors would bear the following in mind:

1. Please write in **BLOCK CAPITALS**.
2. Please **DO NOT** enter dogs belonging to different owners on the same entry form.
3. Please remember that, if you own one dog yourself and another in partnership with someone else, you and the partnership rank as different owners and the dogs should **NOT** be entered on the same form.
4. Please give the date of birth correctly, especially the year. It often means expensive tele-messages or telephone calls and results in a great deal of extra work.
5. Please sign the Declaration.
6. Please state breed(s) entered in all correspondence.
7. Please state whether or not you are applying for membership of the Association.
8. Please make your cheque/Bank Draft/M.O./P.O. payable to the **Gundog Breeds Association of Scotland**.
9. Please post your entries early. Do not wait until the closing date (3rd October 2011).

RULES & REGULATIONS

Vicious dogs are not eligible and must not be brought to the Show
Exhibitors are held responsible for any damage done by their dog during the exhibition.

- 1 The Show will open at 7.00 a.m.
- 2 **Dogs will be received up to 12 noon** after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by any special permission of the Show Management.
- 3 Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m. unless otherwise advised.
- 4 The Show will close half an hour after judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 5 The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6 Entry fees: **Breeds Where CCs are on offer:** First class with each dog £24.00. Each subsequent class with the same dog £3.00. **Non-CC Breeds:** £11.00 First entry each dog. £3.00 each subsequent class. **Not For Competition:** £11.00 each dog. **Veteran & Ch. Stakes** only £11.00 1st entry with each dog. **Brace, YKC Stakes, Junior Handling:** £3.00 each class. CAR PARKING £3.00 payable on the day. Catalogues £4 (pre-paid with entries) (£5 on the day). **Entries may be made online at www.dog.biz. Entries made during the extended online period (4-14 October 2011) will be £25 (CC breeds), £12 (Non-CC breeds)**
- 7 **Prize money:** Stakes Classes (except Veteran, Champion Stakes). First: £10.00; Second £7.00; Third £5.00; Res. £2.00; VHC £1.00.
- 8 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11 **Best Puppy in Show** (Definition: Shows judged on Group system, refer to Regulation F(1)27B). Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly if the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best of Group and Best in Show respectively.
 - (a) **Championship Shows Judged on the Group System**
 - (1) **Best Puppy in Breed.** A Best Puppy must be declared in each breed from puppies entered in the breed classes.
 - (2) **Best Puppy in Group.** Best Puppy in Group and subsequent puppy group placings must be selected from:
 - (a) Those puppies declared Best Puppy in Breed provided that they are unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - (b) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each Group or on each day provided it is unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - (3) **Best Puppy in Show.** Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners provided they are unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - (b) **Withdrawal from Other Competition**

Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best Puppy in Breed prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed classes
 - (c) **Proviso.** For the purposes of this Regulation, a dog beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed, will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- 12 **Best in Show:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show.
 - (a) **Shows Judged on the Group System**

(Definition: Shows judged on the Group system include classes for breeds within more than one Group, as defined in Kennel Club Regulation B(A); and requires a judge to declare a Best of each Group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show).

 - (1) **Best of Breed**

Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed must be declared from those exhibits

which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.

(2) **Best of Group**

Best of Group and subsequent group placings must be selected from:

(a) The Best of Breed winners in each Group provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs.

(b) The best unbeaten winning dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each Group or on each day.

(3) **Best in Show**

Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners provided they are unbeaten. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection of Best in Show.

(b) **Withdrawal from Other Competition**

Dogs which become eligible for Best of Group and Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition (other than Breed Classes and Best of Breed) prior to the competition for Best of Group or Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best of Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes.

(c) **Proviso** For the purposes of this Regulation a dog beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

13 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show and Best Puppy in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

14 No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

15 All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) — Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

16 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17 **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade — take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK, FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

18 Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

19 The Show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations.

20 **Receipt of Entries.** Correctly postmarked entries received after 3rd October 2011 will be accepted but will not be included in the Catalogue. If acknowledgement of entries is required, an addressed, stamped card with "Receipt" written on the reverse should be enclosed. In your own interests use **FIRST CLASS MAIL**. The only proof of posting of entries acceptable to the Committee is the Certificate of Posting issued free by the Post Office, Recorded Delivery or Registered Post. Exhibitors passes will be posted (postal entries), or will be available to download from your dog.biz account (online entries).

- 21 The exercise area for dogs will be outside but within the curtilage of the Exhibition Hall and access will be obtained via the Main Foyer (West).
- 22 All dogs must be brought with a suitable strong chain and collar properly fastened on the dog.
- 23 The Committee is empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition from disease, vice, natural or other causes, and if such exclusion takes place before or after the dog is judged, the entry fee will be forfeited.
- 24 The Catalogues will contain the owners' names in each breed in alphabetical order, with dogs in numerical order. All dogs will be benched in the Catalogue order and owners' dogs of the same breed will be benched together without extra fee. No decorations, pictures, cards or other notices may be placed over the benches except the Official Prize Cards and exhibitor's name and address as per KC Regulations. No bench number shall be changed from one pen to another, and no dog shall be benched on any but its own, numbered pen. Under no circumstances may partitions between the dogs be removed.
- 25 The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and purchasers of dogs and all other persons, that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of or damage to a dog or dogs, boxes, hampers, collars or any other property whatever, arising from accident, or any other cause whatever, nor from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants or others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- 26 No dog may be removed from its bench except for the purpose of being prepared for exhibition, judged, exercised or by order of the Veterinary Surgeon or Show Committee. After being prepared for exhibition the dog must be replaced on its bench. No dog shall be absent from its bench for the purpose of exercise for longer than 15 minutes. If a dog is not on its bench when required for judging, the Committee will not be responsible for its absence from the Show Ring.
- 27 No animal other than a dog duly entered for the show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind.
- 28 **Conversation not allowed in the Judging Ring.** Exhibitors showing dogs are not allowed to hold conversation with the judges during competition. No person other than the exhibitors (officials excepted) will be allowed in the Ring during the judging of classes or specials.
- 29 Should any of the judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagements, the Executive Committee reserves to itself the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned. Subject to the terms of the Kennel Club Show Regulations B1 23(d).
- 30 The Judges will be instructed and empowered to withhold the prize or prizes in any class if in their opinion the dog or dogs exhibited do not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in the Schedule of Prizes.
- 31 All Judges are requested to take the classes in each breed in the order in which they are entered in the Judging Book.
- 32 **Objections and Protests.** All objections must be made in accordance with KC Regulation B1 26.
- 33 The Committee will not be in any way responsible for any claim for injury or compensation occasioned by or arising out of the holding of the Show, or by reason of the act or default of any person in attendance or present thereat.
- 34 In the case of emergency, as to which the Committee shall be the sole judge, the Committee may, at its discretion, alter the place of holding the Show, either before or after the entries are received. In the case of such alteration, no exhibitor shall be entitled to the return of any entry money which may have been paid by him/her before receiving notice of the same.
- 35 All exhibits must be accompanied. The Committee cannot undertake to accept or dispatch unaccompanied dogs.
- 36 Rules and Regulations, or definitions and instructions of the nature of Rules and Regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this Schedule, shall be deemed to be the Regulations of the Committee and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of these Regulations.
- 37 Grooming products on sale at the Show may not meet the requirements of the Kennel Club Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition. In this connection exhibitors are reminded that the responsibility for ensuring that the dogs are correctly prepared for exhibition rests with them and the committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at this show.
- 38 Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the Licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches. Whilst special containers for use of exhibitors and handlers and, if possible, equipment to deal with fouling will be provided, this will not absolve those responsible for dogs being properly equipped. Special stewards will be on duty in an effort to ensure that the foregoing requirements are carried out.
- 39 **Dogs left in vehicles at the Show when the weather is hot.** The Committee reserves the right to take whatever remedial action is necessary in the event of dogs left in vehicles being found in a distressed condition.

- 40 **Committee the Sole Authority.** The Committee shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of these Rules and of the Bye-Laws and Regulations made thereunder subject to the right of appeal to the Committee of the Kennel Club; and the decision of the Committee upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Club or dogs or Dog Shows and not provided for by these Rules or by the Constitution and Bye-Laws or any Regulation, shall be final and binding. A person attending or entering a dog for any Show shall by such act be deemed to have agreed with the Committee to refer any such question or dispute to the Committee.
- 41 The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 42 A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge (this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency); b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
- 43 Every Exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
- 43 **Children:** The parent or guardian of any child causing any damage whatsoever on the showground will be liable to prosecution.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following Definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing for Members Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class **i.e. 26th September 2011.**

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed Class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible.

Exemptions from this Regulation are:

- (a) A Puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed.
- (b) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class.
- (c) A dog in Any Variety Champion Class.
- (d) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge.
- (e) A dog in The Young Kennel Club Stakes Classes.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

2) *Transfer*

- (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height, or in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class, to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY—For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

PUPPY—For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR—For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

YEARLING—For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

- MAIDEN**—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
- NOVICE**—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
- UNDERGRADUATE**—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Championship Shows, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
- GRADUATE**—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- POST GRADUATE**—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- MID LIMIT**—For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.
- LIMIT**—For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.
- OPEN**—For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
- IMPORTED REGISTER**—For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, and are ineligible for any other competition whatsoever.
- YKC STAKES**—For Any Variety dog or bitch exhibited and handled by a fully paid up member of the Kennel Club Junior Organisation. The dog should be registered either; a) Solely or jointly in the member's name or b) In the name of a member of the family and under these circumstances the dog must be resident at the YKC member's address.
- YKC HANDLING CLASSES**—Exhibitors may handle any dog provided it is fully registered on the Kennel Club Breed Register and eligible to be exhibited at Kennel Club licensed events. The first placed exhibitor from each handling class will be invited to take part in a Handling Competition at Crufts 2012, provided as from 1st December 2011 they are a fully paid up member of the YKC. For the purposes of these classes ages should be calculated as their age on the first day of the Show. Entries must be made on the entry form. You are reminded that DOGS MUST be entered in a breed class first where such a class is provided. Please note: Handlers **do not** need to be YKC members to enter handling classes, but must become a YKC member to take part in the YKC Handling competition at Crufts 2012.
- SPECIAL YEARLING**—For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty four months of age on the first day of the show.
- PUPPY STAKES**—Open to all puppies of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show
- JUNIOR STAKES**—For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show
- VETERAN STAKES**—For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.
- FIELD TRIAL STAKES**—For dogs which have won prizes, Diplomas of Merit or Certificates of Merit in actual competition at a Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial Regulations.
- BRACE STAKES**—For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team
- OPEN STAKES**—For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
- MEMBERS OPEN STAKES**—For Any Variety Dog or Bitch, exhibited and handled by a MEMBER OF G.B.A.S. If a dog is owned by a partnership, both must be members.
- NOT FOR COMPETITION**—Societies may at their discretion, accept Not For Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.
- KC BREEDER COMPETITION**—See advert on back cover.

THIS IS A  QUALIFYING SHOW

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- 2
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Not must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

BREEDERS' COMPETITION 2011

The Breeders' Competition offers the following Awards:

Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC classes 1st, 2nd, and 3rd
Best Breeder in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th.
Grand Final at Crufts 2012

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must consist of a minimum of three and a maximum of four dogs of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows:
 - Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes 3 points
 - Second place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes 2 points
 - Third place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes 1 point
 - Best Breeder in Group 4 points
 - Second place Breeder in Group 3 points
 - Third place Breeder in Group 2 points
 - Fourth place Breeder in Group 1 point

The Breeders who have amassed a minimum of 25 points over a calendar year will qualify for the Final/Semi-final in the following year. It is not a requirement to withdraw from the competition upon reaching 25 points. At the end of the competition year in question, Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club which will advise whether they have qualified for the Crufts Final.

Entries must be made by 12 noon. Competition record books will be signed in the Stewards Office.
