DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of **Postal** entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday 30th April 2018**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

Withdrawal - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

Transfer

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or Junior class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of seven years and over on the first day of the Show.

VINTAGE: For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS: For owners, handlers or exhibit not having won a Challenge Certificate in the Breed.

SPECIAL OPEN WORKING: For Beagles which have hunted with a recognised pack, or hold a Working Certificate recognised by the KC from registered Beagle Society, eg The Beagle Club, or has previously qualified for entry to any field trials of The Beagle Club Working Section, or hunted with The Beagle Club Working Section three or more times during the last season.

NOT FOR COMPETITION: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not For Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on the day from any breed.

CLEANLINESS: Please be a responsible Beagle owner at all times and clean up any mess that your hound makes. Do not leave any litter in the Show area. Refuse sacks and cleaning equipment will be provided - PLEASE USE THEM.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17. Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered. **Regulation F.1.c:** Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the first day of the Show are eligible for exhibition at Kennel Club licensed shows. However societies may accept Not For Competition entries at their discretion and dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Not For Competition at all Kennel Club licensed shows. Furthermore, dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Match Competitions.
18. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
19. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Limited Rules & Show Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted. All entries must be made on or before Monday 8th May 2017 (Postmark) upon the entry form enclosed. Online entries may be made up until 12 noon on Wednesday 10th May 2017. The entry fees must accompany the entry form or the entry will not be accepted. Cheques are made payable to "The Beagle Club" and should a cheque for entry fees be returned by the Bank, the exhibitor is liable for bank charges incurred. In the event that an entry has not been received by the Secretary, the entry must be accepted on the day of the Show, subject to conditions of Regulation 8. Such claims will have to be substantiated to the Kennel Club which will request documentary evidence, subsequent to the Show.
20. The committee is empowered to exclude or remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from illness, disease, vice, natural or other causes and if such exclusion takes place either before or after judging, the entry fee will be forfeited.
21. The Judges will be instructed and empowered to withhold any prizes in any class if in their opinion the dog or dogs exhibited do not possess sufficient merit. The Judge's decision shall be final in all cases. Should the Judge be prevented from fulfilling his or her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge or Judges in his/her place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition, but no entry fees can be returned.
22. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and any other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to any dog or person for any cause whatsoever, nor for any act of omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
23. All Rules & Regulations or definitions and instructions of the nature of the Rules & Regulations printed in this Schedule shall be deemed to be Regulations of the Committee and shall have the same effect as if they formed part of these Regulations. Should any question arise not provided for in these Regulations the decision of the Committee shall be final, subject only to appeal to the Kennel Club.
24. Passes will not be sent.
25. The Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition (K.C.S.R.[F]).

Our Championship Show Judges for 2018

Alistair Parker (Chapscroft) - Dogs



Sally and I first acquired a rescue beagle, Prudence, in the mid 70s. It soon became clear that one beagle was not enough and so we bought a puppy to keep her company. This in turn sparked our curiosity about the breed and so we joined The Beagle Club. At that time the idea of drag hunting appealed to us and this introduced us to Jesper and Honor Eades. In those days we lived in Bath and The Beagle Club held its championship show at the racecourse so we used to go along as spectators until we took the plunge and bought our first show puppy from Honor.

One thing led to another and eventually we bought our foundation bitch from Veronica Bradley. Our first litter produced Chapscroft Ember who did very well for us in the ring and gained a Stud Book number although she is probably better remembered for her exploits in the junior handling ring. Tancred followed and although showed very good early promise by winning 3 reserve CCs he alas went prematurely grey and his showing career was cut a little bit short. Since then most of our litters have produced a puppy that has subsequently qualified for the Stud Book but never quite attained that elusive CC. That is until we bred Briar who by winning 20 CCs introduced us both to a wholly different level of showing.

It is always a great privilege to be invited to award CCs in our wonderful breed. This will be my 6th occasion and to be invited to judge at The Beagle Club's championship show is a singular honour.

Jo Norris (Shercroft) - Bitches



My first beagle joined our family in 1980 to help me overcome my fear of dogs. When Candy arrived at 10 weeks old, I can remember being so scared of her I hid behind my dad on the sofa!! Through Candy I overcame my fear and discovered the world of dog showing, having some success in Junior Handling. Our second beagle arrived a couple of years later and then our third, Bondlea Poacher who I handled to obtain 1CC & 2 RCC's.

For my 21st birthday, Marion Hunt gave me half shares in a puppy bitch (Becky) who went on to become CH & IR CH Valsacre Tactful of Bondlea. One of my proudest moments was handling Becky to BOB at Crufts in 1995. I have continued showing dogs in partnership with Marion under

the Shercroft affix with CH Shercroft Flinders JW ShCm being our latest champion. I have also shown beagles under my own affix Sirron.

I have served on the committee of The Beagle Club since 1993 and have been the Assistant Secretary for the last 12 years.

I am honoured to have been invited to judge bitches at The Beagle Club and am very much looking forward to the day.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees: Members @ £11.00 per dog; subsequent classes with the same dog: £1.50. Non-Members @ £13.00 per dog; subsequent classes with the same dog: £2.50. Not For Competition @ £2.00 per dog. Junior Handling (Members) @ £1.50 per class. (Non-Members) @ £2.50 per class. Current Membership rates are: Single £10.00 - Joint £12.00 - Junior (16 years) £3.00 - Overseas £50.00 for a period of four years.
Entries may be made online at www.dog.biz
6. There will be no prize money paid at this Show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition. Puppies over the age of four calendar months of age on the day of the show are eligible to be entered as NFC.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show.**
Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and received a first prize in a class at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. **Best in Show.**
Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A 42.

 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive
- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class, an objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

WELFARE OF DOGS

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries: Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

ADDRESS WITHHELD FOR PUBLICATION.

Please note the points below:

1. Tick the box near your name and address on the front of the entry form if you do **NOT** want your **ADDRESS** to appear in the catalogue. Your name will still be printed above your dog records as normal.
