Regulations For The Preparation of Dogs For Exhibition F (Annex B)

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- 2
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class, an objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Dog Fouling F8(a): Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at a Kennel Club licensed Show within the licensed venue and environs of that event including the car and caravan parks and approaches. The Society will arrange for the dispersal of suitable receptacles to assist compliance with Regulation F8(a).

Attraction of Exhibits F(1) 17f: The attracting of exhibits by any method from outside the ring is prohibited. It is the duty of the Judge, Steward or Show Management noticing such attraction to ask that it cease.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. **Regulation F.1.c** Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the first day of the show are eligible for exhibition at Kennel Club licensed shows. However societies may accept Not for Competition entries at their discretion and dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Not for Competition at all Kennel Club licensed Shows. Furthermore, dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Match Competitions.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. Every exhibitor making entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations and by these regulations and it is on this understanding only than entries are received.
21. The Committee will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to a dog or dogs or any other property whether arising from accident or any other cause whatever, nor from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, servants or any, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
22. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs or any alterations made in this schedule shall be demmed sufficient notice with entries.
23. EXHIBITORS PASSES WILL NOT BE SENT. If acknowledgement of entries is required, a stamped addressed card for the Secretary's signature should be enclosed with entries.
24. Entries must be made on or before **Friday 22nd May 2020**. Please use first class mail and allow plenty of time for delivery. Entries may be made online up to 12 noon on Wednesday 3rd June 2020 at www.dog.biz.
25. No animal other than a dog entered for the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
26. No dog may be removed from its bench except for the purpose of being prepared for exhibition, judged or exercised or by order of the veterinary surgeon of the show committee.
27. The committee will not be held responsible for exhibitors missing their classes.
28. An exercise area will be provided at the show and exhibitors and handlers are requested to clear any fouling made by the dog(s) in their charges. Special bins will be provided.
29. The committee of this show cannot be held responsible for products advertised or sold by stand holders at this show, and remind exhibitors that such products may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
30. The show will be open to the public on admission fee of 50p for adults, 10p for children and senior citizens.

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE: In accordance with Kennel Club guidelines, exhibitors must display exhibit number/owner identification on their crate, cage or container at all times.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 10.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence not before 11.30 noon.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry fees: 1st entry £17.00 per dog, £1.00 for subsequent entries with same dog, £5.00 Not for Competition. Catalogues £3.00 prepaid with entry; £4.00 on the day (limited number) **Entries may be made online at www.dog.biz.**
6. **Prize Money for BIS £100, RBIS £50, BOS £50, BPIS £50, RBPIS £25, BVIS £50, RBVIS £25, BLD & BLB £25, BBD & BBB £25. Mairi Steen Memorial Stakes Classes:** First £5, Second £4, Third £3, Fourth £2, Fifth £1.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and received a first prize in a class at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. **Best in Show.** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Friday 15th May 2020**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19.

(2) Transfer

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
JUNIOR	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
YEARLING	For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the day of the Show.
NOVICE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
POST GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
LIMIT	For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
OPEN	For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
VETERAN	For dogs of seven years and over on the first day of the Show.
CHAMPION	For dogs, which have been confirmed, a Champion, Show Champion or Field Trial Champion.
NOT FOR COMPETITION	Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breed of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

Only puppies of six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are eligible for exhibition, however puppies of four months and over are accepted NFC but must be KC Registered and included on the entry form.

IAN J MILLER (DAZAL)



Born in Auckland, New Zealand, I travelled to the U.K. in 1968 on a three year work visa. My first contract was in Edinburgh, I then returned to London to work and that was where I met my wife to be, Marilyn. We were married in 1970 and in 1971 came to Australia.

In 1973 we purchased our first Dalmatian as a family pet. We were introduced to the show scene by friends and it was soon apparent that "Frodo" Bulgana White Wizard, was definitely not a show dog! In 1978 we purchased our second Dalmatian from New Zealand, "Sam" Ch. Dorian Knight of the Road. Marilyn and I shared the showing duties and Sam obtained his Australian Champion title. Marilyn and I were founding and committee members of the Dalmatian Club of the A.C.T., formed in late 1977.

In 1980 we moved to Melbourne and our first bitch, "Annie" Ch. Paceaway Indigo, joined us. Annie was our first liver spot and almost always shown by Marilyn. Annie soon obtained her title of Champion in strong competition, winning at Dalmatian specialty shows and at All Breeds shows. Both of us were committee members of the Dalmatian

Club of Victoria and heavily involved with the preparation and running of the 1st National Dalmatian Specialty Show. This show is hosted by each member club in rotation every 2-3 years and attracts exhibitors from all across Australia.

In 1983 we moved to Sydney where we still live. In 1984 we bred Annie for our first litter under our prefix of "Dazal". From this litter we kept "Fudge" Ch. Dazal Dairy Fudge, another liver spot, who like her mother did well in the show ring and obtained her title of Champion against quality competition. Fudge won Bitch Challenge and Runner Up to Best In Show at the Dalmatian Club of NSW show in 1990.

In 1987 Annie had her second litter from which we kept "Iggy" Ch. Dazal Dark Crystal, a black spotted bitch who excelled in the ring, winning at both specialty and all breeds shows, under both local and overseas specialist judges. Iggy won Bitch Challenge and Best in Show at the Dalmatian Club of NSW show in 1988 and in the same year Bitch Challenge and Runner Up to Best In Show at the Dalmatian Club of Victoria show.

We bred few litters and only when we wanted a show dog for ourselves. A daughter of Fudge, Dazal Dairy Chocolate gained her Champion title. A son of Iggy, Dazal Devil Made Me Do It was well on his way to his title of Champion when he was retired from the show ring following an injury to his back. We currently have "Neve" Dalmeadow Never Say Never, a black spotted bitch of 13 years who is a much loved and spoilt girl who has never entered the ring, although of excellent type and bloodlines.

During the '90s due to increased work and family commitments, dog showing took something of a back seat, but I remained involved in the dog world, judging and held a number of committee positions within the Dalmatian Club of NSW including President, Treasurer, Show Manager, Show Steward and National Dalmatian Council delegate. In the year 2000, I was again involved with the running of a National show, the 8th. where I was the Show Manager. In October this year the NSW club hosted the 16th National and I have been handling the financial aspects of this event.

Over a number of years I have been and still am, involved with our Club's Welfare committee helping to find new homes for Dalmatians; some of these dogs are rescued from the pounds, others are helped following contact by owners who can longer keep them.

In the late 80's I joined the Dogs New South Wales (our state canine body) judges training scheme. In 1988 I judged my first show, The Dalmatian Club of NSW Open Show and in that same year I judged the Lhasa Apso Club of NSW Open Show. Having completed the scheme and passing both written and practical exams, I was approved to judge and award Challenges to all breeds within our Australian Non Sporting Group 7 and Group 7 Specials.
