## JUDGE PROFILES

### Brian House (Fivejays)

I am delighted to accept this judging appointment as the E.A.C.A. is a Club that I have been involved in for many years, firstly as a committee member, then secretary (for twelve years) and now as a life member.

My first involvement with Rough Collies was from the early age of three. We had moved to a former US Airforce base just after the war, and the first thing my Dad did was to buy two Rough Collies. It wasn't until 1976 when I bred my first Collie litter that I did some rummaging around in my Mum's loft to find their old pedigrees. It was with great surprise and delight to find that they had come from the famous Ladypark kennels. I have had a fair amount of good fortune in breeding Collies and also competing in the Show Ring. I have bred two Rough Champions, and I have also bred a Smooth Collie that became a show and working Champion in Sweden. I have also had the pleasure of winning Best of Breed at Crufts in 1990 with an 18 month old Blue Merle Rough bitch.

I have been awarding CC's in Rough and Smooth Collies for 26 years. My judging CV lists shows, I have judged in Australia, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Holland, Hungary, Ireland, Israel, Norway and Sweden. In 2012 I had the honour of judging Smooth's at Crufts with an entry of 91 dogs. My next appointment will be at Crufts in 2018 judging the Rough bitches. I am really looking forward to judging the dogs at the E.A.C.A. Diamond Anniversary Show, and would like to wish the Club all the best for the future.

### Stella Clark (Astrellita)

I felt most honoured to be asked to judge the E.A.C.A. Diamond Anniversary Show which I was delighted to accept. I had my first Rough Collie in 1967 - Deloraine Dinner Jacket, bred by the late Floss Chapman. He was the most magnificent colour, a deep mahogany with a huge white collar that almost reached down to his feet, something not seen very often these days. Having started to breed Collies, Les and I had some successful winners along the way. One of our most beloved Rough Collies was a tricolour - Astrellita Able Seaman. It was when I met Judith White of Dancerwood fame at a London Collie show that I fell in love with the Smooth Collie and have been besotted with ever since. I had a tricolour from Judith and she became Ch. Dancerwood Bewitched of Astrellita. One of the most famous Smooth's we bred was Ch. Astrellita The Silversmith.

I judged my first Open Show in 1973 and my first Rough Collie Championship show in 1985. Since then I have judged the breed at Championship shows 11 times including Crufts 2014. I have also judged in all the Scandinavian countries and many times across Europe, Russia, Argentina, South Africa and down under in New Zealand and Australia. I gave CC's in five other breeds and have judged over 50 Championship shows in Roughs, Beardies, Borders, Shelties and Great Danes. I am also qualified to judge at Group level, the Pastoral Group which I have now done three times. I have also written a book on Rough and Smooth Collies. I have had a wonderful life with dogs and am now taking less appointments and I think this will be my final time judging Rough Collies, so you could say I am going out on a high. I look forward to meeting you all on this special day.

### Angela Hodgson (Tameila)

My first ever Rough Collie was a sable bitch that I had as a child, and purchased with my pocket money at two shillings a week. My show life with Collies began in the early sixties, and this was with a blue bitch called Tilehouse Siver Shade (Ch. Carramar Boy Blue x Swatterscars Sarona), bred by the late Iris Coombe. I also brought in a tricolour dog by the name of Mywicks Landseer (Ch. M Meadow Lancer x Ch. M Satine of Simbatar). They are both behind my first Champion Tameila Vanity Blue who was BOB at Crufts in 1973. I then ventured back into sables and it was when I had Ch. Dark Delight of Tameila who I mated to Ch. Aberthorne Arrester that produced two pups with the sable dog becoming Ch. Tameila Casey Jones, and his tri sister Tameila Sweet Talk (1CC and 1RCC). I also acquired a son of Casey who was bred by Carol Wills - Ch. Storwill Joe Soap of T. I also owned the tri, Cinclocks Tavenas Spanish Lace who accrued 1CC & 1RCC. I have many memories of Club Shows, especially the YCC in 1981 when Casey took his second CC and BIS from judge Vera Hickson and his dam, Dark Delight took her third CC and RBIS from Jimmy Tait and Casey's son Joe Soap was BPD.

It was in 1986 when I did an outcross mating with T. Blue Charm put to Ch. Upperton Blue Brand that produced the record holding dog Ch. Tameila Gordon Bennett. 16CC's and 13RCC's.

I started judging in 1967 - my first show being Hitchin Limited Show, followed by my first Breed Club Show - E.A.C.A. Sanction Show in 1969. I first awarded CC's in 1982. Despite being well known for breeding Roughs, I have also ventured into Smooth's along the way and bred a sable bitch who was exported to Australia in 1980 to the Milbalind Kennel. She was by Casey x Astrellita Aramist of T. She gained her title and became Ch. Tameila Neat 'N' Tidy. I am very much looking forward to judging Smooth's at the E.A.C.A. Diamond Anniversary Show.

**OPEN:** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

**VETERAN:** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.

**SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES:** To be judged separate from the main show classes. Dogs must be previously entered in the main show before being entered into a SAC. Wins will not qualify to any awards gained in the main show classes. There will be no special award issued. (IE: Best of ...). SAC are being scheduled to assist novice judges with hands-on experience.

### REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
  - A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
  - Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
  - Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
  - The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
  - Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(the word "dog" includes both sexes)

In the following Definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of **Postal** entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. Wednesday 21st June 2017.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible.

Exemptions from this Regulation are:-

- (1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed.
- (2) A dog in Any Variety Field Trial or Working Trial Class.
- (3) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class.
- (4) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge.
- (5) Exhibits bred by the scheduled breed Judge.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) **WITHDRAWAL.** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- (2) **TRANSFER**
  - (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
  - (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
  - (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
  - (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**MINOR PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**JUNIOR:** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**NOVICE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**POST GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**MID LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.

**LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

### Marion Withers (Stanydale)

I grew up with a Shetland Sheepdog and started showing and breeding them under the Stanydale affix in 1979, in joint ownership with my mother. We have enjoyed modest success, having bred a Champion dog and many stud book entry winners over the intervening years. My first judging appointment was in 1984 and since then I have judged breed and variety classes mainly in the Pastoral, Working and Utility groups. I first awarded CC's in Shelties in 2001 and have also judged at Championship level overseas. My other breed is Lhasa Apos and I am on their A3 judging list.

I served on the committee of Colchester and District CS for over 20 years, also as secretary for the East Anglian Branch of the ESSC, and on the main committee of the ESSC since 1997, initially as Treasurer and more recently as Vice Chairman. I am a lecturer and assessor on the Club's Training of Judges Scheme.

I have taken a keen interest in health matters, and I am the KC Shetland Sheepdog Breed Health Representative as well as Treasurer of the Pastoral Breeds Health Foundation, which promotes health testing and research into inherited conditions of breeds in the Pastoral group.

To date I have judged 34 classes of Rough and Smooth Collies, with a total of 88 dogs present. I was delighted to be offered the opportunity to do the Special Awards classes at the E.A.C.A. summer show and I am really looking forward to the appointment.

### Lisa Pettitt (Lakebank)

My life with dogs began as a child when I grew up with Shetland Sheepdogs. I started showing my parents Leepark Rough Collie when I was twelve years old and have never looked back since. I have owned and exhibited several Rough Collie's over the years, their breeding descending from the Astrellita, Rubec and Myriehewe Kennels. Breeding programmes have been limited over the years, but showing has given me a lot of pleasure and I have had the delight of winning several CC's and RCC's with my dogs. They have all lived as part of the family. Over the past years I have served as a committee member on local canine clubs. I am currently the Show Secretary for the E.A.C.A. I also reside on the committee of the E.S.S.C. and am also the Secretary of the East Anglian Branch. I have been judging since 1983 and am approved to award CC's in Rough Collies and Shetlands, having judged both breeds as well as Smooth Collies overseas. I also enjoy attending seminars on Collie related breeds and have a large collection of Collie and Sheltie memorabilia, which includes pictures, photographs, prints, catalogues and old handbooks dating back over the last fifty to sixty years.

I am delighted that the E.A.C.A. is thriving so well in this difficult era of dogdom and hope that it will do so for many years to come. I am looking forward to judging the BIS award for the E.A.C.A. in it's Diamond Anniversary year.

## EAST ANGLIAN COLLIE ASSOCIATION

### CODE OF ETHICS

- 1) Members shall maintain the best possible standards of health and environment for their dogs, not keeping more than they can properly care for.
- 2) Stud Dogs and Brood Bitches shall be in good health and condition, and ideally free from hereditary defects.  
Due consideration should be given to type and temperament before breeding a litter.  
Members shall strive to eradicate hereditary defects from the breed.
- 3) Bitches under the age of **15** months and over the age of **8** years shall not be used for breeding, and neither shall a bitch be bred from more than twice out of three successive seasons.
- 4) Every care shall be taken when selling puppies or older dogs, at home or abroad, ensuring that no stock is sold to laboratories, pet shops or dealers. Breeders shall also help with the re-homing of a dog, sold by them, should this become necessary.
- 5) Members are required to maintain and pass on to buyers of stock, accurate records of health, pedigree and registration documentation, as well as advice on feeding, rearing and general care for the dog.
- 6) Members must accept that, like people, dogs grow old and need special care and attention. They must therefore be prepared to love and care for a dog, for all its life whilst in their ownership.

## RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 10.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging of Rough Collie Dogs will commence at 11.00am; Bitches at 10.30am. Judging of Smooth Collies will commence at approx. 12.30pm.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all the judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching area is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.

8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **Best Puppy in Show**
  - (a) Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
  - (b) *Withdrawal from Other Competition:* Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes and Best Puppy in Breed prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety classes when judged before Breed classes.
  - (c) *Proviso:* For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **Best in Show**
  - (a) The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the Judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
  - (b) *Withdrawal from Other Competition:* Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety classes when judged before Breed Classes.
  - (c) *Proviso:* For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
  15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
  16. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) – Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
  17. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor.
  18. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
    - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
    - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
    - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
    - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
    - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
    - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
    - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.
  19. **Not for Competition:** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
  20. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
  21. Remedial action will be taken by the Committee in the event of dogs being found in a distressed condition in vehicles.
  22. **Fouling and Grooming Waste.** Any person in charge of a dog must remove any faeces and/or grooming waste immediately. Please use designated areas where bins are provided for the disposal of waste.
  23. No animal, other than the exhibits and those visiting for eye testing will be allowed within the precincts of the Show.
  24. The Committee of the E.A.C.A. does not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage to persons, dogs or property whilst entering or leaving the Venue. Upon this understanding only are Entries received.
  25. Parents will be responsible for the behaviour of their children within the precincts of our Show and Events.
  26. If acknowledgement of entries is required a stamped self addressed postcard should be enclosed with entries for the Secretary's signature.
  27. Should any question arise not provided for in these rules, the Committee's decision is final, subject to appeal to The Kennel Club.
  28. No person whilst an undischarged bankrupt may serve on the Committee of, or hold any other Office or Appointment within a Kennel Club registered Society.
- TRADE STANDS.** The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by standholders at the Show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- EXERCISE AREA.** Please respect the venue and use the Exercise Areas provided. Exhibitors/Owners are required to clear up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge and to keep all dogs on leads whilst exercising.
