JUDGE PROFILES

Natalia Skalin (Skabona)

I was involved in dogs almost since my birth. My family had German Shepherds and my older brother was very interested in training and showing. I was very keen on having a dog and finally had my first one when I was 12 years old. It was a present from my brother and of course it was a G.S.D. I was very happy with him, but I was dreaming about having a Rough Collie as our neighbours had a dark sable bitch which is when I fell in love with the breed. I then had a Shetland Sheepdog from Germany, and it was then I registered my affix 'Fantazija'. My dream about having a Rough came true in 1990 when I was studying at the Lithuanian Veterinary Academy when I got my first Rough Collie, a blue merle bitch called Lucky Star Silver Zinnia, bred by Mrs Dina Korna from Estonia. The first Fantazija litter was born in 1991, (Shetland Sheepdogs), and my first Rough Collie litter I bred in 1993. In 1995 I bought two Smooth Collies. A Tricolour male from Mrs Dina Korna and a blue merle bitch from the UK bred by Karina Le Mare. I am very grateful to Stella Clark for her help, when Helmiake Hot Woman became the foundation bitch of my Smooth Collies breeding. In 2012 I moved to Sweden with my husband Bo, and we registered a new kennel name 'Skabona'. So after 20 years of breeding under the Fantazija kennel name my Swedish life and Skabona breeding began. I am proud to be a breeder of over 65 Champions, 30 International Champions, Europa Winners and a World Winner - 2012. We have bred the Rough Collie of the year in Finland 2016 and 2017. Our dogs have won at the European and Scandinavian shows such as Swedish, Norwegian, Danish Winner Shows. We have also had BOB at the Nordic Winner show 2015, 2016 and 2017 with three different dogs. Multi Ch. Kiss 'N' Hug Fantazija became a GB Ch and our biggest pride is taking Int/Multi Ch. Chelborn Desirable (bred by Mrs Vanessa Cronk), to the Crufts CC 2016 and CC and BOB at Crufts 2018. She has also won BIS at the British Collie Club Championship Show 2015. My husband and I are international FCI Allround judges. We have judged all over the world at the most prestigious shows as European and World Winner and Breed Club Shows. I am very much looking forward to coming over to the UK to judge at the EACA show in August.

Edith Pryor (Aqualita)

I brought my first Rough Collie in the late 70's from David and Lorraine Bellinger of the Jurassic Collies. Her name was J. Becky, and she was mated to J. Flash Light, and produced 5 dogs. I kept one and called him Sonny. He was quite successful in the show ring. I then applied for my affix - Aqualita, and had another Collie from the Jurassic kennel, a Blue bitch who was also by J. Flash Light. I later mated her to Astrellita Able Seaman and kept Aqualita Mischievous. Continuing on with my breeding I have used Collies from Corydon and Wicani lines - my aim in trying to keep what I consider the correct Collie type, at the same time as breeding sound, healthy stock.

I became quite successful in the show ring having won CC's, and other top awards, and other exhibitors have also had success with Collies that I have bred. I have also in the past bred Shetland Sheepdogs. I have been judging for many years, and am approved to award CC's in the UK, and have also judged abroad. I am Secretary for the Riddings Canine Society, and serve on three other show committees, one of them being the Yorkshire Collie Club. I also enjoy running a ring craft club, and organising fun shows for charities. He also managed boarding kennels, and looked after many different breeds including Deerhounds, Flatcoat Retrievers, Beardies, and Lhasa Apso's. I am looking forward to judging my favourite breed - Rough bitches at the EACA championship show.

Lindsay French (Lindfern)

It wasn't until I was 14 years old, that I had my first dog. I had fallen in love with the Rough Collie but my mother would only agree to me having a smaller breed, the obvious alternative choice was the Shetland Sheepdog. I bought a beautiful blue eyed merle bitch and we had a lot of fun with her and a fair degree of success in the show ring. Sadly she died at only 6 years of age never having been bred from.

Many years passed before I got another Sheltie. In 1994 I was granted my affix Lindfern, and have shown regularly at Open and Championship shows since then. I have bred and handled my own dogs to win CCs and RCCs. I am a "B" list judge for Shetland Sheepdogs and have passed all the relevant exams which are required for future progression to the "A" List.

My first appointment judging Rough Collies was at an Open Show in 2014. Since then I have judged them at Open show level in various locations around the country. I would like to thank the committee for inviting me to judge the SAC's at the summer show, and would also like to thank those who enter and allow me honour of judging your Rough and Smooth Collies.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES: To be judged separate from the main show classes. Dogs must be previously entered in the main show before being entered into a SAC. Wins will not qualify to any awards gained in the main show classes. There will be no special award issued. (IE: Best of). SAC are being scheduled to assist novice judges with hands-on experience.

CHAMPION: For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion, Show Champion or Field Trial Champion.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2.
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(the word "dog" includes both sexes)

In the following Definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of **Postal** entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. Saturday 23rd June 2018.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible.

Exemptions from this Regulation are:-

- (1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed.
- (2) A dog in Any Variety Field Trial or Working Trial Class.
- (3) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class.
- (4) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge.
- (5) Exhibits bred by the scheduled breed Judge.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) **WITHDRAWAL.** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- (2) **TRANSFER**
 - (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Pat Hutchinson (Karibuni)

I have owned Rough Collies since 1978 and, despite giving up the breeding and exhibiting of my dogs in 2014, I continue to have pleasure in judging and stewarding.

I began judging in 1982 and awarded my first Rough Collie Challenge Certificates in 2006. I am also currently on the A3 lists for both Smooth Collies and Shelties, and have judged Border Collies at Club level and have also judged Open Show Pastoral and Working Groups on many occasions.

My overseas judging engagements have also given me much pleasure and, to date I have awarded Rough, Smooth Collie and Sheltie CAC's in Russia, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Austria, Germany, Israel and Eire.

In 2001, the late Iris Combe, Dareen Bridge and I published the successful book 'Rough Collies of Distinction'. I also spent five years as the East Anglian Regional Adviser for the KC's Assured Breeder Scheme, a role I found most fulfilling.

My involvement with the EACA goes back to 1980 when I was co-opted onto the committee to help with catering. I held the position of Secretary for ten years during the 80s and 90s and since then have enjoyed the roles of Web Master, Health Coordinator and Vice-Chairman.

Many thanks to the EACA for inviting me to judge BIS at its 2018 Championship Show.

CODE OF ETHICS

- 1) Members shall maintain the best possible standards of health and environment for their dogs, not keeping more than they can properly care for.
- 2) Stud Dogs and Brood Bitches shall be in good health and condition, and ideally free from hereditary defects.
Due consideration should be given to type and temperament before breeding a litter. Members shall strive to eradicate hereditary defects from the breed.
- 3) Bitches under the age of **15** months and over the age of **8** years shall not be used for breeding, and neither shall a bitch be bred from more than twice out of three successive seasons.
- 4) Every care shall be taken when selling puppies or older dogs, at home or abroad, ensuring that no stock is sold to laboratories, pet shops or dealers. Breeders shall also help with the re-homing of a dog, sold by them, should this become necessary.
- 5) Members are required to maintain and pass on to buyers of stock, accurate records of health, pedigree and registration documentation, as well as advice on feeding, rearing and general care for the dog.
- 6) Members must accept that, like people, dogs grow old and need special care and attention. They must therefore be prepared to love and care for a dog, for all its life whilst in their ownership.

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 10.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging of Rough Collie Dogs will commence at 11.00am; Bitches at 10.30am. Judging of Smooth Collies will commence at approx. 12.30pm.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all the judging has been completed.
5. **Entry Fees:**
 - MEMBERS ROUGHS:** £12.00 per dog first class, subsequent entries same dog £1.50
 - SMOOTHs:** £ 5.00 per dog first class, subsequent entries same dog £1.50
 - NON-MEMBERS ROUGHS:** £17.00 per dog first class, subsequent entries same dog £2.50
 - SMOOTHs:** £ 7.00 per dog first class, subsequent entries same dog £2.00
 - SPECIAL AWARD CLASS:** £3.00 per dog.
 - NOT FOR COMPETITION:** £3.00 per dog.
 - CATALOGUE:** £4.00 with entry only.
 - ROSETTE DONATION:** £2.50 per class
 - ADVERTISEMENTS:** £20.00 Full Colour Page
 - MEMBERSHIP FEES:** £6.00 Joint, £4.00 Single (1st January – 31st December)

Exhibitors applying for first time membership must complete an application form. All members are expected to abide by our Code of Ethics that can be found elsewhere in this Schedule.
6. There will be no Prize Money paid at this show except in the Stakes Class.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed. (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy) A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show and subsequent placings must be selected from puppies which have been declared Best Puppy in Breed (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy)
11. **Best in Show.** The dog declared Best in Show must be selected from Best in Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy). Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the breed judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17. **Not for Competition:** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
 18. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
 19. Remedial action will be taken by the Committee in the event of dogs being found in a distressed condition in vehicles.
 20. **Fouling and Grooming Waste.** Any person in charge of a dog must remove any faeces and/or grooming waste immediately. Please use designated areas where bins are provided for the disposal of waste.
 21. No animal, other than the exhibits and those visiting for eye testing will be allowed within the precincts of the Show.
 22. The Committee of the E.A.C.A. does not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage to persons, dogs or property whilst entering or leaving the Venue. Upon this understanding only are Entries received.
 23. Parents will be responsible for the behaviour of their children within the precincts of our Show and Events.
 24. If acknowledgement of entries is required a stamped self addressed postcard should be enclosed with entries for the Secretary's signature.
 25. Should any question arise not provided for in these rules, the Committee's decision is final, subject to appeal to The Kennel Club.
 26. No person whilst an undischarged bankrupt may serve on the Committee of, or hold any other Office or Appointment within a Kennel Club registered Society.
- TRADE STANDS.** The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by standholders at the Show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- EXERCISE AREA.** Please respect the venue and use the Exercise Areas provided. Exhibitors/Owners are required to clear up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge and to keep all dogs on leads whilst exercising.

ADDRESS WITHHELD FOR PUBLICATION.

Please note the points below:

1. Tick the box near your name and address on the front of the entry form if you do **NOT** want your **ADDRESS** to appear in the catalogue. Your name will still be printed above your dog records as normal.
2. Your address is still needed for the sending out of schedules and exhibitors passes. So you must still enter your address in the normal way.
