CODE OF ETHICS

- 1) Members shall maintain the best possible standards of health and environment for their dogs, not keeping more than they can properly care for.
- 2) Stud Dogs and Brood Bitches shall be in good health and condition, and ideally free from hereditary defects.
Due consideration should be given to type and temperament before breeding a litter.
Members shall strive to eradicate hereditary defects from the breed.
- 3) Bitches under the age of **15** months and over the age of **8** years shall not be used for breeding, and neither shall a bitch be bred from more than twice out of three successive seasons.
- 4) Every care shall be taken when selling puppies or older dogs, at home or abroad, ensuring that no stock is sold to laboratories, pet shops or dealers. Breeders shall also help with the re-homing of a dog, sold by them, should this become necessary.
- 5) Members are required to maintain and pass on to buyers of stock, accurate records of health, pedigree and registration documentation, as well as advice on feeding, rearing and general care for the dog.
- 6) Members will only use 'Social Media' for the promotion of the breed, and not for the selling of puppies and older stock.
- 7) Members must accept that, like people, dogs grow old and need special care and attention. They must therefore be prepared to love and care for a dog, for all its life whilst in their ownership.

Health Register

The Health Register includes both KC/BVA and DNA test results for all Rough Collie breed-related health issues – HD, CEA/CH, PRARcd2, MDR1 and DM. The Register is an invaluable tool for breeders wishing to check out the health status of specific dogs/bitches.

There are currently in excess of **200 Rough Collies** on the database, and anyone wishing to have their dog's details included must please submit the following information: KC registered name of Collie; sire and dam; colour; sex; year of birth; copies of relevant health certificates and a high resolution image (preferably full profile).

The CEA Register of DNA-tested clears and carriers, now has **35 Rough Collies** listed.

N.B. The EACA accepts test results from all laboratories.

Judge: JOHN CARTER (MONTZELLA)

I started showing GSDs in 1960, and began breeding them in 1963. Not long after then, I bought a boarding kennels and added more breeds, namely Shih Tzus, with a couple of Miniature Poodles and Yorkshire Terriers.

I showed the GSDs and Shih Tzus with great success, making up several champions in both breeds, and have also won a BOB at Crufts.

I first started judging in 1969 and my first appointment was at Bedford show. In six classes of GSDs I had 117 dogs, which is a far cry from breed numbers at Open shows these days. I continued to judge and was eventually passed to award CCs in 1978. In 1980 I took on my first appointment to judge another breed – this being the Border Collie. To date at Open level I have now judged 94 different breeds at over 300 shows and well over 2000 classes, plus all seven groups, and have completed 82 BIS appointments. I now give CCs in 10 breeds within three groups which includes three breeds at Crufts. I have judged in many European countries and also Australia.

I have also served on canine club committees having been the secretary and treasurer of Colchester & DCS, and up until last year secretary of Clacton & DCS. I have also held chairman's positions and am an honorary vice-president of my own breed clubs.

I am looking forward to the honour of judging the Collies at the EACA – a breed which I first judged way back in 1984.

Judge: STEPHANIE PRESDEE (PAMPARDOUR)

Living in Herefordshire, I have owned horses and dogs for many years. Although owning Rough Collies, Borzois, Flatcoat Retrievers and Pekingese, I have been associated more with working and obedience training rather than the show ring. As a dedicated supporter of Pro-Dogs, my first Rough Collie 'Brett' became one of the first registered PAT dogs and I was one of the founder members of the Rough & Smooth Collie Training Association (RSCTA).

I have bred and exhibited Rough Collies since 1975. My first dog was from Silvafox breeding and was line-bred back to Dazzler of Dunsinane. It was 'Brett' who introduced me both to the show and obedience ring. He was soon joined by other Rough Collies from the Jefshire, Glenmist and Chelines kennels, though more recently I have owned two of Pat Hutchinson's 'Karibuni' Collies.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES: To be judged separate from the main show classes. Dogs must be previously entered in the main show before being entered into a SAC. Wins will not qualify to any awards gained in the main show classes. There will be no special award issued. (IE: Best of). SAC are being scheduled to assist novice judges with hands-on experience.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Karibuni Jezebel with Pampardour (born in 1996 and sired by Ingledene Love Is The Drug) was a consistent winner gaining several BPs and BOBs at Open Shows. She also won a group placing under Val Geddes, a 2nd at Birmingham National under Crawford Taylor, and a 2nd under Brian House at Windsor, and was placed Reserve in the PGB class at Crufts under Jean Lawson also culminating in a first in Limit and a Res CC at Paignton under John Geddes.

Jezebel's half-brother 'Karibuni Kilimanjaro' qualified for Crufts by winning 2nd in the Puppy dog class at the 2001 Working & Pastoral Breeds Championship Show at Builth. Later that same year, my husband and I emigrated to Spain for eight years with the dogs, where we established a boarding kennels. Whilst living there I only showed my Pekes. We returned to the UK in 2009 with five veteran dogs, and since then travelling and showing opportunities have been limited, although my young Pekingese won a first at Crufts in 2014.

I took my Rough Collie Judging exam in 1999 with the EACA, and I would like to thank the committee for asking me to judge the Special Award Classes at their April Open Show.

RULES and REGULATIONS

- The Show will open at 9.30 a.m. with the commencement of the AGM.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 11.30am with the Rough Dogs and Smooth Collies. Judging of the 3 Special Award classes will take place during the lunch break, and the judging of the Rough Bitches will commence after lunch.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all the judging has been completed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching area is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- Entry Fees:**
MEMBERS - ROUGHS/SMOOTHS: £4.00 per dog first class, subsequent entries same dog £2.50. **SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES:** £2.00 per dog.
NON MEMBERS - ROUGHS/SMOOTHS: £6.00 per dog first class, sub. entries same dog £2.50.
NOT FOR COMPETITION: £2.00 per dog.
CATALOGUE: £3.00 with entry (£4.00 on the day). Pre-paid Catalogues must be collected by 1.00 p.m. or they will be made available to other exhibitors.
ROSETTE DONATION: £2.50 per class.
ADVERTISEMENTS: £6.00 full page, £4.00 half page.
MEMBERSHIP FEES: £4.00 Joint, £3.50 Single (1st January – 31st December). Exhibitors applying for first time membership must complete an application form. All members are expected to abide by our Code of Ethics that can be found on the reverse of this Schedule.
- There will be no Prize Money paid at this show.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition, unless entered in the Puppy Stakes class.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- Best Puppy in Show.**
 - Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - Withdrawal from Other Competition:* Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from AV Classes when judged before breed classes.
 - Proviso:* For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

12. **Best in Show.**
- (a) The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining unbeaten Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the Judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
- (b) *Withdrawal from Other Competition:* Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from AV Classes when judged before breed classes.
- (c) *Proviso:* For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
16. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) – Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
17. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor.
18. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
- WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.
19. **Not for Competition:** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
20. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
21. Remedial action will be taken by the Committee in the event of dogs being found in a distressed condition in Vehicles.
22. **Fouling and Grooming Waste.** Any person in charge of a dog must remove any faeces and/or grooming waste immediately. Please use designated areas where bins are provided for the disposal of waste.
23. No animal, other than the exhibits and those visiting for eye testing, will be allowed within the precincts of the Show.
24. The Committee of the E.A.C.A. does not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage to persons, dogs or property whilst entering or leaving the Venue. Upon this understanding only are Entries received.

25. Parents will be responsible for the behaviour of their children within the precincts of our Show and Events.
26. If acknowledgement of entries is required a stamped self addressed postcard should be enclosed with entries for the Secretary's signature.
27. Should any question arise not provided for in these rules, the Committee's decision is final, subject to appeal to The Kennel Club.
28. No person whilst an undischarged bankrupt may serve on the Committee of, or hold any other Office or Appointment within a Kennel Club registered Society.

TRADE STANDS. The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by standholders at the Show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

EXERCISE AREA. Please respect the venue and use the Exercise Areas provided. Exhibitors/Owners are required to clear up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge and to keep all dogs on leads whilst exercising.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(the word "dog" includes both sexes)

In the following Definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of **Postal** entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. Saturday 11th March 2017.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this Regulation are:-

- (1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed.
- (2) A dog in Any Variety Field Trial or Working Trial Class.
- (3) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class.
- (4) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge.
- (5) Exhibits bred by the scheduled breed Judge.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) **WITHDRAWAL.** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- (2) **TRANSFER**
 - (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

UNDERGRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Championship Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed, Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE

ADDRESS WITHHELD FOR PUBLICATION.

Please note the points below:
