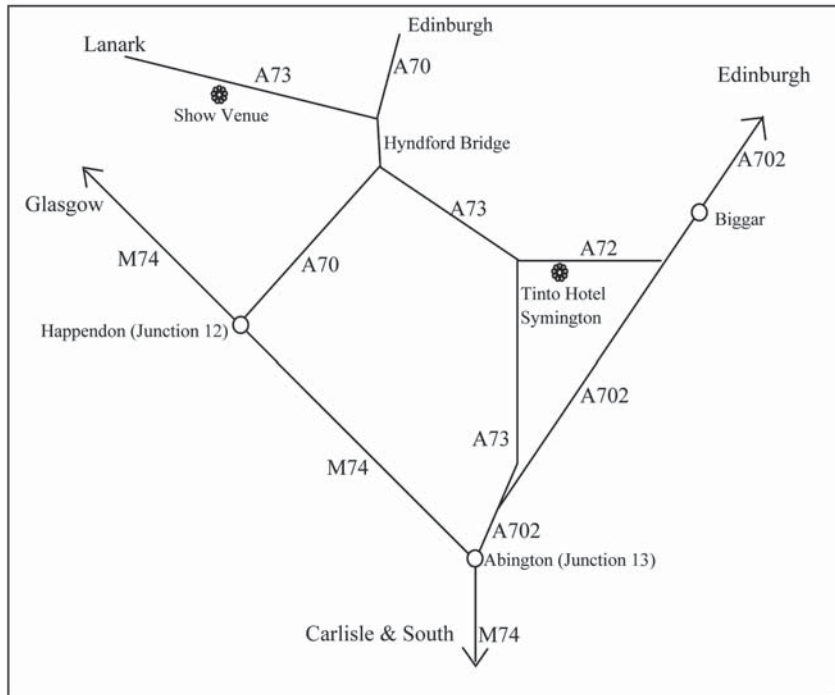


DIRECTIONS



Directions to Lanark Agricultural Centre (ML11 9AX)

From Carlisle and the South: Take M74 north. Leave the M74 at junction 12 (Happendon). At the junction, take A70 exit to Edinburgh, staying on the A70 at the roundabout (2nd exit). Continue for 7 miles to Hyndford Bridge. At Hyndford Bridge take the A73 (Lanark), continue for 1.2 miles on the A73, going through one roundabout, venue will be on the left.

From Glasgow and the North: Take M74 south and leave at junction 12 (Happendon), follow directions as above.

From Edinburgh: Take A70 to Ayr/Lanark, just before Hyndford Bridge take A73 to Lanark, go through one roundabout, show venue will be on left.

Directions to Tinto House Hotel (ML12 6FT)

From Carlisle and the South: Take M74 north. Leave the M74 at junction 13 (Abington). At roundabout take 3rd exit to Edinburgh, at second roundabout take A702 to Edinburgh. Continue for 1 mile and at 3rd roundabout take A73 (Lanark), after approx 7 miles turn right onto the A72 to Symington/Biggar. Proceed for approx 1 mile, hotel on right.

From Glasgow and the North: Take M74 south and leave at junction 12 (Happendon), follow A70 to Hyndford Bridge then take A73/A72 to Biggar, continue for approx 7 miles then turn left (A72) to Symington. Continue for approx 1 mile, hotel on right.

From Edinburgh: Take A702 to Biggar, proceed through Biggar. On leaving Biggar take first right on to the A72 (Symington). Proceed for 3 miles, hotel on left.

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders' Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must comprise four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Twenty points are required to qualify for Finals at Crufts in the following year. Points are cumulative over a calendar year and are gained as follows:

Breed win 1 point
Fourth in Group 1 point
Third in Group 2 points
Second in Group 3 points
First in Group 4 points

Breeders gaining 20 points should apply to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club to apply for the Crufts Final. After amassing 20 points a breeder cannot enter any further Best Breeder Competitions for that calendar year.

2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must comprise four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.

7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.

Third in Group 2 points
Second in Group 3 points
First in Group 4 points

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- PREPARATION FOR EXHIBITION:** All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F Annex B Regulations for the Preparation of for Exhibition.
- DOG FOULING/GROOMING WASTE:** Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is requested to remove immediately any fouling caused by their dog/s and also any grooming waste, at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the environs of that event, including car park and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
- RESPONSIBILITY:** The committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs enter for exhibition and for any property entrusted to them, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and other persons that the committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to any dog or person for any cause whatsoever, nor for any act of omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others. and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.
 - A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A 42.
- No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

MINOR LIMIT: For dogs which have not won 2 Challenge Certificates or three or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN: (7-9 years) For dogs of seven years and not exceeding nine years of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL VINTAGE: (10 years and over) For dogs of ten years and over on the first day of the Show.

JUDGE OF DOGS
CTC CENTENARY WEEKEND
JOINT CAIRN TERRIER CLUBS CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

There was a love of dogs and a particular interest in show dogs on both sides of my own pedigree so I could hardly escape wanting to follow in their footsteps.

The Oudenarde affix was granted by the Kennel Club in 1928. My aunts, Helen Hamilton and Margaret (later Temple) mainly had Cairn Terriers, but also Pekingese, Smooth Fox Terriers and Airedales. After the war came Irish Terriers, Beagles and Japanese Chin, introduced by Sheila Tarry and her mother. By this time my mother had joined the partnership and she introduced Dalmatians, English Setters and Border Terriers.

In 1977 I married Stafford Somerfield whose late wife Dibble was one of the stalwarts who introduced the Boxer to the UK.
