PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO RIGHTS

The Organisers would like to bring the regulation on photography and filming to the attention of exhibitors, trade stands, press and visitors.

It is a condition of all those attending the event that no filming or other form of recording may be taken or made at the venue without the express written permission of the organisers. The taking of photographs in the show venue for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. Press accredited photographers are provided with permission to take photographs ONLY for use in newspapers, magazines and internet sites - this is for news purposes only. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs of general views of the Show, provided that these are for private use. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor. No photography or filming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place. However, judges may allow it to happen at the end of classes or after the Challenge Certificate is awarded. Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the rings at all times unless the operation of the camera is actually affecting exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or if it is clear that exhibits are being affected, a ring steward or the judge is empowered to stop the person concerned.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

The word DOG includes both sexes

PUPPIES UNDER SIX CALENDAR MONTHS OF AGE ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR EXHIBITION

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show Award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in Breed Classes where Challenge Certificates were not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing for Members specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class (i.e. Monday 6th February, 2012).

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both breed and variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed Class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible Exemptions from this Regulation are:

- (a) A Puppy, unless a class for dogs under 12 months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the Breed
- (b) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class
- (c) A dog in Any Variety Champion Class
- (d) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge.
- (e) A dog in YKC Stakes Classes.
- (f) A dog in Good Citizen Scheme Classes.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) **Withdrawal**

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) **Transfer**

- (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy, Puppy and Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively of the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy, Puppy or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively of the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

Minor Puppy—For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

Puppy—For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

Junior—For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

Maiden—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted), whether restricted or not.

Novice—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted), whether restricted or not.

Graduate—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Post Graduate—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not, where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Mid Limit—For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.

Limit—For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.

Special Limit—As Limit but confined to colour.

Special Open—As Open but confined to colour.

Open—For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

Veteran—For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

YKC Stakes—All pedigree dogs are eligible to take part provided the dog is registered on the Kennel Club breed register. The dog must be registered a) solely or jointly in the member's name or b) in the name of a member of the family and under these circumstances the dog must be resident at the YKC member's address. No substitute handlers are permitted — the dog must be handled by the YKC member. Members are not permitted to allow another individual to show their dog on their behalf if they are not able to attend the class. Members must be aged 6 - 24 years (for members 6 years and up to, but not including 25th birthday). **Crufts 2013 Qualification Procedure:** The first placed member only in each dog group will qualify for Crufts. A rosette and prize money is awarded. If the first placed member has already qualified, the Crufts qualification will roll down to the next member (down to 3rd place only).

CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW REGULATIONS

EXHIBITORS' ATTENTION IS PARTICULARLY DRAWN TO REGULATION 23.
VICIOUS DOGS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE AND MUST NOT BE BROUGHT TO THE SHOW.
Exhibitors are held responsible for any damage done by their dog during the exhibition.

1. The Show will open at 7.30 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received from 8.00 a.m. until 12.00 noon, after which time no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
3. Judging will commence at 9.00 a.m. prompt in all rings unless indicated otherwise on the proposed judging on page 9. Exhibitors will be responsible for their dogs being in time for judging.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club. The show will close half an hour after judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **Entry Fees.**
Breeds with Challenge Certificates. First Class £21.00, second and subsequent classes £3.00. Non-CC Breeds (Australian Silky Terriers, Bolognese, Coton de Tulear and Havanese): First Class £12.00, second and subsequent classes £3.00. Not For Competition £10.00.
Veteran and Champion Stakes: If entered in Breed Class £3.00; If NOT entered in Breed Class £12.00. Entries may be made online at www.dog.biz.
7. **Prize Money** will not be paid, except in Stakes Classes which are as stated.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is strictly forbidden.
11. **Best Puppy in Show.**

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best in Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.

a. **Championship Shows Judged on the Group System.**

(1) **Best Puppy in Breed**

A Best Puppy must be declared in each breed from puppies entered in the breed classes.

(2) **Best Puppy in Group**

Best Puppy in Group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from:

(a) Those puppies declared Best Puppy in Breed provided that they are unbeaten by any other puppy.

(b) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day provided it is unbeaten by any other puppy.

b. **Withdrawal from Competition**

Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes and Best Puppy in Breed, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety classes when judged before Breed classes.

c. **Proviso**

For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

12. **Best in Show**

The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show.

a. **Shows Judged on the Group System**

(Definition: Shows judged on the Group System as defined in Kennel Club Regulation B(A); and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show.)

(1) **Best of Breed**

Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed must be declared, from those exhibits which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.

(2) **Best of Group**

Best of Group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from:

(a) The Best of Breed winners in each Group provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs.

- (b) The best unbeaten winning dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each Group or on each day.

(3) **Best in Show**

Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners provided they are unbeaten. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection of Best in Show.

b. **Withdrawal from Other Competition**

Dogs which become eligible for Best of Group and Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes and Best of Breed, prior to the competition for Best of Group or Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best of Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety classes when judged before Breed classes.

c. **Proviso**

For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Group or Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) — Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
17. **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.
- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade — take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK, FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

18. Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. All entries must be made on or before **Monday, 13th February, 2012**, upon forms enclosed for that purpose. All monies must be sent at the time of making entries and cheques and postal orders must be made payable to **The United Kingdom Toydog Society**.
20. No dog may be removed from its bench except for the purpose of being exercised, prepared for the Show Ring, Judged, or by order of the Veterinary Surgeon or Show Committee.
21. An exercise area will be provided at the Show and Exhibitors and handlers are requested to clear up any fouling made by the dog(s) in their charge. Special Bins will be provided.
22. If a dog is not on its bench when required for judging the Committee will not be responsible for exhibitors missing their classes.
23. Conversation is not allowed in the Judging Ring between Exhibitors and Judges.
24. Gangways must be kept clear of obstructions, and Officers of the Society are empowered to see any such obstruction is removed.
25. Should any question arise not provided for in these regulations the decision of the Committee shall be final, subject to appeal to the Kennel Club.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

- 1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule 42.
- 2
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class, an objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE: It is most important to put your **correct postal address** on the entry forms. Failure to do so will result in your catalogue passes being **delayed** or **not received** by you at all.

Address should include: House number (not just house name) - Postal town - Correct postcode.

Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC classes 1st, 2nd and 3rd

Best Breeder in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th

Grand Final at Crufts 2013

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team.
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must consist of a minimum of three and a maximum of four dogs of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows:

Best Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	3 points
Second place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	2 points
Third place Breeder in Breed/AVNSC Classes	1 point
Best Breeder in Group	4 points
Second place Breeder in Group	3 points
Third place Breeder in Group	2 points
Fourth place Breeder in Group	1 point

The Breeders who have amassed a minimum of 25 points over a calendar year will qualify for the Final/Semi-Final in the following year. It is not a requirement to withdraw from the competition upon reaching 25 points. At the end of the competition year in question, Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club which will advise whether they have qualified for the Crufts Final.

Members are not permitted to allow another individual to show their dog on their behalf if they are not able to attend the class.

Members must be aged 6-24 years (for members 6 years and up to, but not including 25th birthday).

Crufts 2013 Qualification procedure: The first placed member only in each group at the qualifying show will qualify for Crufts. A rosette and prize money is awarded. If the first placed member has already qualified, the Crufts qualification will roll down to the next member (down to third place only).

LIMITED OBEDIENCE SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

These Rules and Regulations are to be read in conjunction with the Kennel Club Obedience Show Regulations G under which this show is licensed. It is the responsibility of everyone entering this show to make themselves familiar with the Kennel Club G Regulations, available from the Kennel Club.

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Obedience Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Obedience Shows.
4. Entry is limited to Toy Breeds listed in the Toy Group of the Kennel Club Breed Register.
5. Dogs which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club are not eligible for entry at this Show.
6. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form.
7. Obedience Classes are not available to enter online - Postal entries only.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date.
10. Where dogs are entered solely in classes with a full running order they will be received at any time. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
11. Timed stays will take place and will take priority over other tests; the times will be published at the show and in the catalogue.
12. For the duration of the show all dogs, including those in the exercise area, must be on a lead except when competing or practising prior to competition.
13. Animals allowed in Event.
No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.

14. A dog shall be disqualified and removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
15. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
16. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
17. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
18. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. There is no prize money on offer.
20. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
21. **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS**
Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
22. **Welfare of Dogs**
A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

1. Dogs are ineligible to compete at Limited Shows which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Obedience Champions are only eligible to compete in Class C at Open and Championship Shows.
2. A dog must be entered in the lowest scheduled class for which it is eligible and may also be entered in another class if desired, one special class excepted.
Exemptions from this regulation are:- A dog entered in a Good Citizen Dog Scheme Special Pre-Beginner Obedience Stakes Class or a Young Kennel Club (YKC) Obedience Class which may also be entered in a maximum of two other scheduled classes (including YKC classes) for which it is eligible.
3. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class.

PRE-BEGINNERS	To compete in Pre-Beginners a handler or dog must not have won a First Prize in either Pre-Beginners or Beginners nor gained a third place or above in any other obedience class.
BEGINNERS	To compete in Beginners a handler or dog must not have won a total of two or more First Prizes in Beginners Class, or one First Prize in any other Obedience Class. (Pre-Beginners excepted).
NOVICE	For dogs which have not won two First Prizes in Obedience Classes. (Pre-Beginners and Beginners excepted).
CLASS A	For dogs which have not won three First Prizes in Class A, B and Open Class C in total.
CLASS B	For dogs which have not won three first prizes in Class B and Open Class C in total.
OPEN CLASS C	At Open Shows, and in the Open C Classes held at Championship Shows, open to all dogs.

Recall from sit or down position at handler's choice. Dog to be recalled to heel by handler, on command of Judge or Steward, whilst handler is walking away from dog, both to continue forward until ordered to halt. The recall and halt points to be the same for each dog and handler.

Retrieve a dumb-bell

Sit two minutes – handler in sight

Down three minutes – handler out of sight

Scent discrimination. The handler's scent on a marked cloth supplied by the Judge. There must be a total of six scent cloths, this total must not include any decoys, but must include the cloth provided by the judge. These six cloths must be set out in a straight line, which may be in any direction.

Class B

Heel Free

Send Away, Drop and Recall

Retrieve any one article provided by the Judge

Sit two minutes – handler out of sight

Down five minutes – handler out of sight

Scent discrimination. The handler's scent on a marked cloth supplied by the Judge. There must be a minimum of six and up to a maximum of ten scent cloths, the total must include one decoy cloth and the cloth provided by the judge. The pattern of cloths is at the Judge's discretion.

From the North

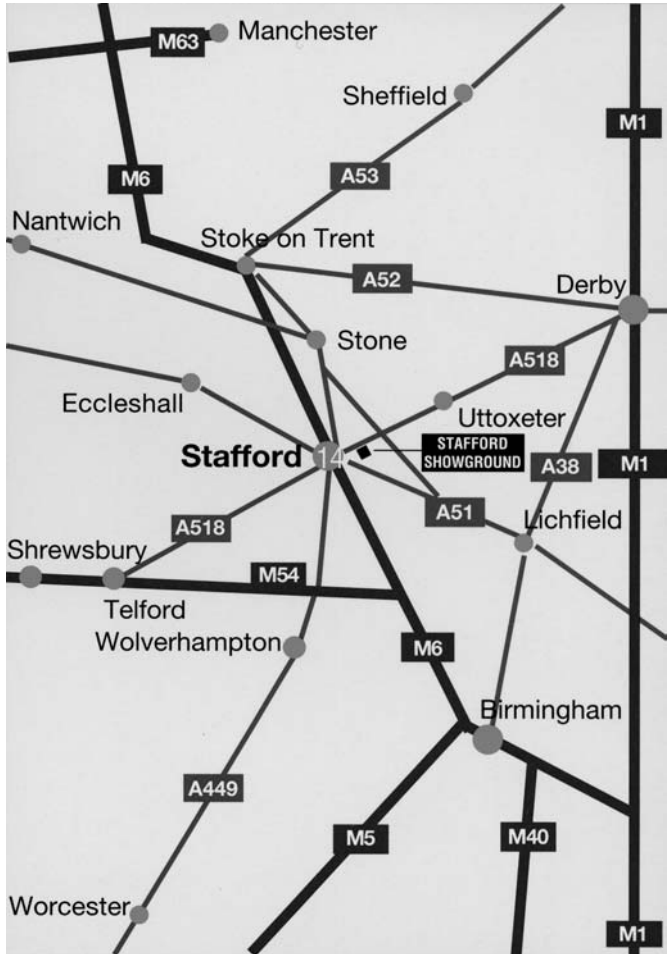
- The M6 is a major route for those travelling from the north. Exit at junction 14, as above.
